

Election of Officers

Each year at the conference, the MML 1st Vice President automatically ascends to the office of President, and the 2nd Vice President automatically ascends to the office of 1st Vice President.

The new 2nd Vice President is elected during the conference in a paper ballot election managed by representatives from the Mississippi Association of Clerks and Collectors.

This year, the 2nd Vice President will be elected from the Southern Supreme Court District. To be eligible to vote, a city or town must have paid their dues for the current year by May 15, 2021, and must have designated a voting delegate, as well as an alternate by July 21, 2021.

The voting delegate designated by the governing body of the city or town shall cast the vote of such municipality in accordance with the expressed views of the majority of the elected officials of his or her municipality. If, for any reason, the designated voting delegate cannot participate in the election, it is his or her responsibility to return to the Voting Delegate Booth accompanied by the alternate designated to replace him or her on the voter roll.

The election will take place in Room B4 on Tuesday, July 27 between 10am and 4pm.

If the appointed voting delegate has not cast his or her vote by 3pm on Tuesday, July 27, the alternate voting delegate will automatically be allowed to cast the vote for MML 2nd Vice President.

If needed, a run-off election will be held in Room B4 on Wednesday, July 28 between 8am and 10am.

If a run-off election is required, and the appointed voting delegate has not cast his or her vote by 9am on Wednesday, July 28, 2021, the alternate voting delegate will automatically be allowed to cast the vote in the run-off election for MML 2nd Vice President.

Election results will be announced at the General Session on Wednesday, July 28.





Meet the Candidates for



MAYOR TOBY BARKER City of Hattiesburg

Toby Barker serves as the 35th Mayor of Hattiesburg. Elected in 2017, Barker's first term was highlighted by the city's financial recovery, job growth, significant investments in infrastructure, increased community support for public schools, new funding for the arts and city parks, data driven COVID response and winning two federal grants to build the first railway overpasses in downtown Hattiesburg. These successes led to his overwhelming reelection this year, where he won every precinct and 85% of the overall vote.

Before he was elected mayor, Barker served 10 years as the District 102 state representative in the Mississippi House of Representatives. Elected in 2007 at the age of 25, he was the youngest legislator at the time and was an active member on the Appropriations, Education, Public Health and Medicaid committees. His principal legislative accomplishments included

helping create the first program to fund early childhood education, modernizing the state's foster care system and reforming several aspects of the criminal justice system.

His work in performance-based budgeting and evidence-based policy helped make Mississippi a national leader in the use of data-driven decision-making.

As a legislator, he learned to build diverse coalitions to get things done. He gained a reputation as a problem solver who worked hard, took tough votes and unapologetically fought for his Central Hattiesburg district.

Toby Barker, 39, graduated from Meridian High School in 2000. He then moved to Hattiesburg to attend The University of Southern Mississippi. There, he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications (2004) and a Master of Science degree in economic development (2006). In 2015, he earned his Master of Healthcare Leadership degree from Brown University.

He lives in the historic Parkhaven neighborhood with his wife, Kate, and their two children, Audra (4) and Mack (3). They attend the Ekklesia Church in Hattiesburg.

MAYOR JOHN HENRY BERRY Town of D'Lo

John Henry Berry was first elected Mayor of D'Lo in 2009. Since that time, Mayor Berry has completed two phases of a three phase sewer project. D'Lo has received \$1.5 million in sewage grants, \$300,000 in water grants, and a \$30,000 MDOT grant, as well as a \$100,00 grant for a new fire station.

John Henry was one of the first mayors to legalize golf carts in the state of Mississippi. House Bill Number 1771 was passed on August 9, 2017. Home to the D'Lo Water Park, Mayor Berry has continued improvements to the park with the addition of frisbee golf.

Mayor Berry is a 1981 graduate of Simpson County Academy and a 1983 graduate of Copiah Lincoln Community College. He is a member of D'Lo Methodist Church.






